Individual log in ID and password to access NLIST resources have been provided to all the faculty members, too.
- Computerization of library official activity e.g. book number creation and spine level printing etc. has been done.
- Creation of cataloguing (bibliographic) database with the help of Windows version of CDS/ISIS has been done. Searching facilities of bibliographic details from book database have been provided.
- Statistical data such as collection turnover, circulation of reading materials per month, reference transactions per year, reading room usage, e-resource access etc. help to manage the library services and initiate good practices.
- Introduction of ICT based facilities in classes using portable projectors and establishment of two smart classrooms.
- Purchase of different required equipments and chemicals for Physics, chemistry and Geography Laboratories.

The Human Resource of the college is managed in a fair and democratic manner. The aim of the college is to make optimum use of the available human resources. All faculty members are involved in different activities.
